

Movie Review: Pitong Kabang Palay



Simple, Effective and Affecting. The film captures the lives and struggles of farmers in the province. They deliver the message that they like to convey and they utilize the strength of the kids to touch our heart. The child actors and actress are really good in this film from Micko Laurente to Alfonso Ynigo Delen up to Precious Meil Espinosa. Pitong Kabang Palay is closest in terms of representation of farmers in our society and what the festival aims to achieve. The surprise for me in this year's ToFarm Film Festival 2016.



'Pitong Kabang Palay' presents Real Scenario of Farmers' in Isabela



ToFarm Film Festival chose this entry of **Maricel Cariaga** titled 'Pitong Kabang Palay' as one of the six competing films because of its simplicity in storytelling but leaves a nagging truth about the real plight of Isabela farmers after harvest time. It is the time that they call—'gawat' or 'tag-hirap' because the farmers really do not have any source of income for four months.

Filmmaker Cariaga chose her home province as the setting of her movie, which she considers closer to her heart since she and her husband are both farmers in real-life. Isabela is the Philippines' second largest province and the largest in the island of Luzon in terms of land area, but the reality of it all—not all farmers own the lands they till. Most farmers are just 'nakikisamak' or a better term for it is that—'nakikipisan' or rely on percentage on the yields of the farm.

She crafted the story just for a week prior to making it to the festival's deadline in December last year, but since her familiarity of the topic—it wasn't such a challenge to finish it and eventually got chosen and was granted a Php1.5 million-seed money to start filming the script she wrote.


Despite the fact that her province is strategically located in the center of Cagayan Valley region and considered to be the country's second highest rice-growing and the top corn-producing province, Maricel is challenged to make a statement through her film. Her film also attempts to celebrate the most treasured resource of her province—the Isabelinos with its trademark of being survivors and have the resilient spirits.

She chose Isabela as the backdrop of her film because she wants to show how the farming situation in the said province, unlike Bataan, Bulacan, Nueva Ecija and Nueva Vizcaya—it is non-irrigated. Their plants rely only on rain or if the fields are near the rivers then it is the only time they can start planting or harvesting.

"The film is very simple. It presents a reality on how farmers get to survive for four months after they harvest their crops until the time they harvest again," Cariaga shares.

'Pitong Kabang Palay' revolves around Balong, the second child, smart and gleeful kid, who knows how his parents persevere in order to make both ends meet. And because of his parents' love and determination, he imbibed such traits and turns out to be an industrious, reliable and loving son and a brother to his kin. The story points out the real treasure of his parents and that is he.

Heading the cast members are **Arnold Reyes** and **Sue Prado** as the husband and wife—Jaime and Adelaide dela Cruz. **Micko Laurente**, the Best Child Performer of the Year 2016 at PMPC Star Awards is the eldest son—Lito while **Alfonso Yñigo Delen** is Balong and Precious Miel Espinosa as the youngest child—Shirley.

SYNOPSIS

Three generations of courageous women will teach you the most important lessons in life. A poor dreamer who reaches the top, an Aeta teacher who dreams of passing the licensure exam, a veteran educator who believes a teacher never quits. They all meet in a place where the dreamers and the dream become one.

"Teaching is not a profession; it's a devotion." Ito ang kwento ng tatlong guro na hango sa totoong buhay. Si lah Bantang Seraspi (Anna Luna) ay anak ng isang mangingisda sa Romblon. Mahirap ang kanilang pamilya kaya sinikap ni lah ang pagiging scholar. Tutol ang kanyang ama (William Martinez) sa pagiging guro sa akalang walang asenso ang ambisyon ng anak. Hindi pinanghinaan ng loob si lah bagkus lalo siyang naging determinado upang makapagtapos ng pag-aaral. Confidante at sumusuporta sa pangarap niya ang kanyang kaklase at kapwa Education student na si Poldo (Paul Salas). Napatunayan ni lah na hindi dahilan ang kahirapan upang sumuko. Kaya naman naging Cum Laude siya. Naghahanda naman siya sa LET (Licensure Examination for Teachers) kaya nag-review siya. Dito niya nakilala si Gennie (Angeli Bayani), isang Aeta na makailang ulit pumalya sa pagkuha ng LET. Si Gennie naman ang nagpatuloy sa pagtuturo ng kapwa katutubo sa Tarlac matapos simulan ng mga misyonaryo ang pagtatayo ng eskwelahan ng Tarukan. 30 taon siyang nagtuturo sa paaralan. Binabagtas niya ang limang oras na paglalakad at pagtawid ng ilog upang magbigay kaalaman sa mga Aeta. At kapag may hindi nakakapasok na estudyante si Gennie dahil sa kahirapan ay kinukumbinse niya ang magulang ng bata upang magpatuloy sa pagaaral. Ito naman ang nagiging dahilan sa paglayo ng loob ni Nonoy (Karl Medina), asawa ni Gennie. Natutuwa kay Gennie si Ms. Espie (Gloria Sevilla). Kahit matanda na ay dedicated pa rin sa pagtuturo si Ms. Espie. Nais na siyang patigilin sa pagtuturo ng kanyang anak (Suzette Ranillo) upang magkaroon sila ng oras sa isa't isa dahil iginugol ni Ms. Espie ang kanyang panahon sa pagtuturo. Napag-isip isip din ni Ms. Espie na mas mahalagang pagbigyan ang kanyang anak ngunit hindi pa rin siya titigil sa pagbabahagi ng kaalaman.

Summation of CEB member

It is "well-made advocacy film that movingly pays tribute to teachers in the barrios who selflessly choose to serve the grassroots at the expense of a stable financial income and oftentimes personal comfort. This is an "advocacy film that does not get too didactic. It is a quiet and effective film that is able to pay tribute to a most under-appreciated sector of society." It is "highly inspirational, although at times, it may become pushy in promoting its message."

To summarize: "The movie touches you in all the right places."

It may be slow at times but the pace was probably chosen to mirror the long, arduous treks that teachers have to take to get to their schools. The sweeping cinematography in fact shows how literally, teachers climb mountains and cross rivers to get to the schools; in this film, it is a far-away school in Sitio Tarukan.

There are three teachers whose stories we see in the film and they all meet in Carl Balita's Review Center. Iah (Anna) is a young lass from Romblon University and despite dire straits, she manages to graduate cum laude. She sometimes starves herself, goes without sleep for days and cannot even afford Manila paper for her presentations. Yet her desire to become a licensed teacher and help her family improve in life prods her on to continue her struggle.

Gennie (Angeli) is a para-teacher in Tarukan committed to teaching her Aeta community and has not given up in trying again and again to take the licensure exam. She does not only attend to the students' needs in school but also she goes out of her way to convince her students' father to bring his children back to school, whether it is kaingin season or not. She finds a friend and a tutor in lah and their wait for the results of the exam becomes an exciting one.

Esperanza (Gloria Sevilla) is a veteran educator and Review Center lecturer who is the true model of dedication and commitment despite her age and poor health. Her inspirational poems and her pep talks are legendary in the Review Center and she will only retire if she can continue writing books and poems to encourage more people to become the best teachers they can be.

The director seamlessly weaves these three stories in the "narrative linearity" of the film. "The inclusion of the actual lah, Gennie, and Esperanza in the CBB gives the film the impact of the movie's message." The audience will see for themselves that the three characters they have come to admire on the big screen are all real and living testaments of how noble some people can be.

"The ensemble cast headed by Anna Luna and Angeli Bayani is particularly convincing in portraying this often under-recognized heroes." "The three female leads are all very good because they all gave understated performances." "Angeli is true to form as usual while Anna turned in a brilliant portrayal of lah." "There were excellent performances across the board."

"This is a fitting tribute to teachers and it should be shown in schools so that teachers and students alike will see how much respect the teachers should be getting." "The movie makes one wonder how one teacher or another has made an impact in his or her life."

"Congratulations! This is a masterpiece. Every teacher and student in the Philippines should see it!" "This should make a round of schools.
