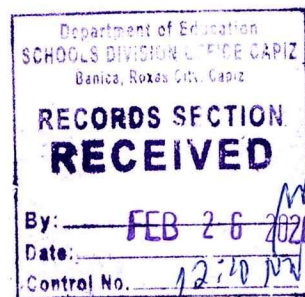

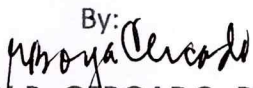

1. The deadline of submission list of delegates and payment the Council Junior, Senior and Cadet Camp will be on or before February 28, 2026.
2. Every camper and chaperone should be physically fit.
3. The Miss Camp Candida Belo 2026 will be conducted as fund raising drive that aims to finance the needs of the campsite's structures repair and renovation plans. The highest donation will be proclaimed as Miss Camp Candida Belo 2026 either in Junior/ Senior/Cadet level. Each school/district will donate P500.00 for those who do not have candidate. A qualifying donation of P3, 000.00 for each district/school. A sharing of 70% -30% will be observed; 70% will be remitted to the Council for the said repair and renovation and 30% will be given back to the participants.

VENUE: GSP Capiz Council

The attire during the Coronation Program of Miss Camp Candida Belo 2026 be GSP Official Uniform (for non-candidates and qualifying candidates) and Gowns (for the Queen and Runners – up).

4. Solar lamp or lights are allowed inside the tent. Electrical lights and wiring are strictly prohibited.
5. Charging Station for Cellphones for campers will be provided at a minimal cost of P50.00 for the whole duration of the camp. They will bring their receipt and ID every time they want to charge their cell phones. There will be a schedule for charging. Participants are not allowed to go to the charging station when activities and sessions are ongoing.
6. Every camper/adult chaperone should bring two (2) galloons of drinking/distilled water for the whole duration and refill can be purchased within the campsite only.
7. Only Grades 5 and 6 for Junior Level, Grades 8-10 for Senior Level and grades 11 -12 or 17-21 years old for the Cadet Level be qualified to attend the Council Camp. Before the camp, the district delegation should be by patrol, minimum of 8, maximum of 10 members.
8. Each patrol must cook their own food and they must bring their own cooking utensils such as cooking pot, frying fan, knives, charcoal stove/ kalan- firewood stove, pail with cover, dipper and basin.
9. A Trading Post provided inside the camp and is accessible to all campers to buy the needed ingredients for their food– e.g. vegetable, meat, egg, etc. No camper will be allowed to go out/ buy outside of the campsite for the whole duration of the camp.
10. All schools/district will put up three (3) garbage receptacles in their respective camp houses. It will be checked by the Health and Sanitation Officer and this will be one of the criteria in selecting the Cleanest and Nature Friendly Sub Camp.

11. There will be no visiting hours. On the morning of the March 6, parents and vehicles are allowed to enter to drop camp equipment until 12 NN and must leave the camp site by this time. By 12:30 NN, it is strictly prohibited for the parents and vehicles to enter the campsite. On March 8, parents and vehicles will be allowed to enter by 3PM after Break Camp.
12. Parents of the Miss Camp Candida Belo Royal Court members and candidates will be allowed to enter and join the coronation program on March 7, 2026, 7:30 AM.
13. VIP and Car Passes will be provided to the invited guests and speakers. Suppliers' pass will be also given to the supplier of the trading post for the camp's food supplies. Passes must be presented at the camp entrance when arriving (VIP) and delivery of the supplies (Supplier).
14. For long staying vehicles of chaperones and camp staff, you are allowed to park at the designated parking areas in front of Staff House.
15. Log in – Log out sheets will be provided at the camp entrance. You are hereby encouraged to fill up for security purposes.
16. Attending Chaperone will have their attendance at the Secretariat Post (Staff House) daily. DTR, Certificates of Appearance and Participation will be included in the envelope containing certificate of participation by District/ School.
17. In case of emergency and sickness, please notify the medical team stationed in your subcamps for immediate action.
18. There must be a sand and water standby in the patrol's cooking area in case of fire occurrences.
19. Do not leave your personal bags with important papers or things unattended. In case of loss, please notify your respective Camp Directors or Program Coordinators.
20. **OPENING PROGRAM** – Attire will be Official Uniform and wearing of Scarf will be by sub-camp. The scarf will be provided by school or district (4 inches width, 1 1/2-meter length).

21. **ORIENTATION** will be done by the Central and Subcamp Staff, Medical, Security, and Fire Personnel.
22. **SCOUT'S OWN** – Theme: Love on nature. It should be done by Sub-Camp. Attire be in Official Uniform. All schools/districts must bring their candles for the Scout's Own.
23. **EXTRAVAGANZA** – Theme: Municipal Festivals. Presentation will be done per Municipality/ Town.
24. **GRAND CAMPFIRE** – Theme: Metamorphosis, Juniors – Flora, Senior/Cadet -Butterfly. A 5-7 min. Presentation will be done per Sub-camp. Each school/district will donate one (1) bundle of firewood to be turned over to the Sub-Camp Program Coordinators.
25. **ENVIRONMENTAL ADVOCACY** – Clean – Up Drive inside the campsite for Subcamp Juniors Level. Tree planting and clean-up drive for the Subcamp Seniors/ Cadets. Attire will be Active Wear/ Camp Uniform. Each subcamps will bring garbage bags.
26. **FARM TOUR and OBSTACLE COURSE AT CHANDY'S INTEGRATED FARM.** Attire will be dark colored shirts and pants.
27. **SCHEDULE OF COURT OF HONOR MEETING BY SUB CAMP** – EVERY 12:30 NOON. VENUE: PROGRAM CENTERS

**FOOD TECHNOLOGY
FOR SENIORS/ CADETS LEVEL**

Cooking chicken in aluminum foil buried under soil

Materials: 8 meters aluminum foil Matches Woods Charcoal (uling) Medium stones (30 pcs) Itak Chopping board Bowls Knife	Ingredients: 1 whole chicken Tanglad Ginger Yellow ginger or dulaw (optional) 2 cloves garlic 5 medium size onion 7 pcs Calamansi Salt to taste Pepper to taste Sugar to taste ½ cup Cooking oil Soy sauce
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1. Prepare the Chicken

Clean and season the chicken with salt, pepper, herbs, garlic, or marinades.
Wrap it tightly in **aluminum foil** to prevent dirt or ash from entering.
Double-wrap for extra protection.

2. Prepare the Cooking Pit

Dig a hole about **1–1 1/2 feet deep** and wide enough to fit your chicken parcel.
Line the bottom with **stones or bricks** (they retain heat).

3. Heat the Stones

Build a **wood fire** in the pit over the stones. Burn until stones are very hot.
Remove most of the embers, leaving hot stones at the bottom.

4. Place the Chicken

Put the foil-wrapped chicken directly on the hot stones. Cover with a few embers for extra heat.

5. Seal the Pit

Cover the chicken with a layer of soil. This traps heat and creates an oven effect.

6. Cooking Time

Let it cook for **2 hours**, depending on chicken size.

7. Retrieve and Check

Carefully dig up the parcel. Open foil and check internal temperature. If not fully cooked, rewrap and return to pit.

Safety Notes

Avoid using treated wood or stones that may explode when heated.
Keep children and pets away from the pit while cooking.
This method is rustic and less predictable than a modern oven, so patience and caution are key.
