MONITORING GUIDE

- 1. The Public Schools District Supervisor (PSDS) is the Chairman of the District Monitoring Team, co-chaired by the District Research /Innovation Coordinator and 2 or 3 school heads. (in adherence to D.O No. 02, s. 2024).
- 2. Elementary, secondary, and integrated school teacher-researchers/teacher innovators (proponents) who have an approved proposal will be monitored/evaluated by the District Monitoring Team.

However, if the proponent refuses to be monitored or evaluated, he/she will not be required to do so but will lack evidence on the implementation of the study.

- 3. The proponent must show his/her innovation-intervention tool used to address the problem as a means of verification (MOVs) based on the approved proposal.
- 4. All other provisions in the monitoring tool must be present during the monitoring.
- 5. The monitoring team will give the original copy of the accomplished monitoring tool to the proponent that will be attached to his/her completed/terminal report (a photocopy shall be kept for the district file).
